Planned Works Nursery

We were due to have some minor refurbishments to our relocated Nursery Classroom during the Summer holiday and due to circumstances outside of the school's control, this did not happen. However, we have been given indication by the appointed diocesan building services that the project will start this term. The early years team of teachers are committed to managing the changes whilst works go on and we want to notify you that there will be inevitably be some temporary changes to the use of the early years block. As soon as we have met with the building services early next week, we will have an idea of what changes need to be made. Great teamwork and great co-operation will overwhelm short term disruption and the end result will be improved facilities for our children! Thank you to all the Early Years parents for your commitment.

Reading and Curriculum Matters

Large investment has been made in reading and we have asked you to support reading at home particularly in Key Stage One. Children who leave new phonic linked books at home on a regular basis delay their progress in class We will continue to send text reminders where children have not returned books and we ask you to sign the reading log books so we know that they have spent some time being listened to at home.

We are intending to issue another pupil progress report at the end of term which, like last year, will be in addition to the end of year report. It will focus on the core subjects of English and Mathematics and how are children are recovering in their learning from the last eighteen months.

Staffing

Year 5 6 H parents will know that their teacher Miss Hannah has been signed off on ill -health for an extended period of time and we are all concerned that she makes a good recovery.

Replacing staff has become a very significant challenge for all schools in this next stage of the pandemic. Teaching supply agencies are struggling to meet demand. However, I am pleased to say that we have managed to appoint Mrs Aideen Haughey to teach Miss Hannah's class from next Friday. Mrs Haughey is an experienced teacher and I look forward to her joining our teaching team.

We are currently in a recruitment exercise for Mrs Tyrrell and Mrs Morgan who begin their maternity leave in January and the end of this month respectively.

School Nativities

There has been much speculation about school traditional nativities this year and Covid. When one thinks of the *bursting* at the seams school hall scenario filled with parents and grandparents, angels and shepherds, schools are adapting.
